

I am excited to invite all of you to attend The Thirteenth Conference on Health Care of the Chinese in North America on October 21st-22nd, 2006 in New York City.



The purpose of this conference is to present the state-of-the-art features of several major topics in cardiovascular diseases and the medical as well as surgical approaches in treatments. Special emphasis will be made regarding the Chinese American population. Several other topics related to Chinese American Health issues also will be presented.

There will be two key-note speakers. Dr. Gordon Fung of San Francisco will begin on Saturday with his lecture on Cardiovascular Diseases in the Asian Population. Attractions of New York City







- The body of the abstract should be in a single paragraph, typed single space. Please use at least a 12-point typeface. The entire abstract, including title, authors, affiliation and text should fit into a rectangle 5" (width) by 7" (height). Leave neither a top or a left margin within the rectangle.
- Please, no fancy styles or borders.
